ANTI-SLAVERY STATEMENT

Silverlink Software Limited (“Silverlink”) supplies software into the UK healthcare market and is one of the leading patient administration systems (PAS) providers to the National Health Service. Given the nature of Silverlink’s business, the Company does not rely upon a wide range of suppliers and none of the suppliers the Company uses are critical to the provision of services to our customers.

Whilst Silverlink’s annual turnover does not exceed £36 million and as such, the Company is not obliged to prepare a statement in accordance with the Modern Slavery Act 2015 (“the Act”), Silverlink is committed to the protection of human rights and protecting against traces of slavery in its supply chain.

Silverlink has reviewed its list of suppliers and has verified that those suppliers that are obliged to prepare and publish a statement under the Act have done so, and that they have confirmed that appropriate measures are being taken to monitor and manage the risk of slavery in their own supply chains.

The Company has also considered those suppliers who do not fall under the scope of the Act and given that they are UK based Silverlink has concluded that they do not present a material risk of introducing modern slavery into supply chains.

Silverlink will continue to monitor and assess potential risk areas in its supply chains on an ongoing basis.
